## A LETTER FROM OUR **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**



Dear Friends of Austin Creative Reuse.

On April 1, 2022, we celebrated our first full year being open in our new expanded creative reuse center in Windsor Park, East Austin. When we moved into the space in March 2020, we had no idea the challenges that our community - and the world - were about to face. For the last two years, we have used our creativity - the core of what inspires us - to find ways to fulfill our mission and support a community in the grips of a global pandemic.

While Covid-19 remains a part of our collective experience, over the last year we have grown into our new home to become the largest creative reuse center in Texas and one of the largest in the country. This fiscal vear we have increased our team of staff and volunteers, expanded our donation capacity to keep even more materials out of the landfill, offered innovative programming like our first reuse fashion show, opened our first dedicated workshop space, joined hands in new collaborations across the city and so much more!

In June 2021, we hit perhaps our greatest milestone yet - diverting our one millionth pound of usable creative materials from the landfill! Together with our community, we are making real environmental and climate impacts right here in our community.

## ONE MILLION POUNDS DIVERTED

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

It all started with a backyard and a dream. Before ACR even had a dedicated, physical center, we were diverting materials from the landfill through donation drives and giveaways.

Just how much is 1 million pounds? Roughly the weight of 3 blue whales!


JUNE 21, 2021 We reach 1 MILLION pounds of material donations


#### The Lifecycle of a Donation

Once donations are dropped off at our center, they go through a quick sorting process. Volunteers then do a finer sorting and packaging of materials to get items ready to sell. Our customers purchase the items then turn them into reuse masterpieces. Any leftovers can be donated back and the cycle starts all over again!





Both income and expenses increased significantly in FY2022 as we wrapped up our first fully open year in our new center. At 11,000 sq. ft., our new center is more expensive to operate than our original center, but it also offers more than seven times the space and diversion capacity and makes us the largest creative reuse center in Texas!




ACR invests approximately \$2 per pound of material diverted to get those materials processed and back into the hand of the artists, makers, teachers and everyone in our community.
