The Big Move.

We experienced growth beyond expectations and in ways we didn't think possible, thanks to the love and support of our community. That love fueled our move to a bigger and better 11,000 sq ft reuse center in March 2020. The new center will host our retail store and materials processing, plus an expanded workshop with room for our community to come together.

We opened to the public for only 11 days before temporarily closing due to COVID-19, but what an amazing start! Our fiscal year ended in March 2020 under the weight of a pandemic, but we look forward to welcoming the public back into the center to explore, learn and create together again soon.

Why Reuse?

When Austin Creative Reuse became a non-profit 10 years ago - yes, it's been that long! - we knew Austin would embrace our mission of promoting conservation and reuse. This is a city that would make reuse a first choice for any activity or project. When we reuse, we reduce our landfills, save natural resources and keep harmful chemicals out of our environment. Who could ask for more?

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that Austin households discard an average of 26.25 pounds of trash every week? (1) This includes an estimated \$11 million in reusable items each year. (2) In fact, the City of Austin estimates that about 90 percent of all discarded materials headed to the landfills are reusable, recyclable or compostable. (3)

This is where ACR comes in! With the support of our amazing donors, shoppers and volunteers, ACR helps the Austin community decrease the amount of trash sent to landfills by diverting reusable materials and making them available for reuse in our center. We are improving access to affordable materials, educating our community about the benefits of reuse as a first choice and fostering creativity by asking users to "think outside the lines." We're doing our part to help Austin reach its Zero Waste Goal by 2040.



Diverted materials include items sold in the store as well as items that are recycled, sent to Austin Resource Recovery, or composted, as well as items such as clothing and books, which are sent to partner reuse organizations, such as Recycled Reads, Josco, and local thrift stores like Treasure City Thrift and Goodwill.

We look forward to diverting even more materials in our new, larger space this year!



FISCAL YEAR 2020: APRIL 1, 2019 - MARCH 31, 2020




TOTAL REVENUE
