We invite you to flip through these pages and celebrate what we have accomplished together.






Our staff and volunteers had to move around every single one of those pounds in order to get them back into the hands of our community!




FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

When the pandemic hit, ACR quickly pivoted to set up an online store and offer contactless curbside pickup. We also got creative and hosted outdoor sales, offered personal shopping via videoconferencing, and even had a pop up shop in the Brentwood neighborhood! In the end, our revenue was down **only 19.7%** compared to the previous year.

WHERE THE MONEY CAME FROM



We believe that creative reuse is for everyone and intentionally price our materials to be affordable. The average cost per item we sold last year was \$1.26. What could that buy at a traditional craft store? Not much! At ACR, it's a gallon bag of crayons, five fabric remnants and much more! Why were wages such a high percentage if ACR was closed? We kept our staff employed throughout the entire pandemic shut down without a single furlough, lay off or cut in hours. We even added paid time off for all staff, including those who work part time!



At Austin Creative Reuse, we pride ourselves on being open and honest with our community. This year, we acquired the Guidestar Platinum Seal of Transparency.
